This qualification is typically delivered over a duration of 12 months, including 120 hours of work placement.



Upon completion of this qualification, students are eligible to apply for roles such as:

- Disability Support Worker
- Community Care Worker
- Residential Care Support Worker

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### DURATION

This qualification is typically delivered over a duration of 12 months, including 120 hours of work placement.

### DELIVERY

The training is conducted by a qualified, industry current, trainer and assessor to ensure the learning is relevant and up to date. This training will take place in a classroom environment using face-to-face training methods at one of our study locations. Intakes are scheduled throughout the year.

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification, although applicants will need to undertake an LLN assessment. Students are required to complete a Practical Placement which requires a police check, an NDIS screening and students must hold a Working with Children's Check.

### FURTHER STUDY OPTIONS

Upon completion, students could go further with their study with our CHC43015 - Certificate IV in Ageing Support.
