COURSE INFORMATION

This qualification reflects the role of a variety of workers who use a range of factual, technical and procedural knowledge to provide assistance to health professional staff for the care of clients. Health services assistance involves the worker in direct client contact under supervision.



This qualification is typically delivered over a duration of 27 weeks, including 80 hours of work placement in an approved facility.



Upon completion of this qualification, students are eligible to apply for roles such as:

- Acute care assistant
- Operating theatre technician
- Food services worker (hospital)

DURATION

This qualification is typically delivered over a duration of 27 weeks, including 80 hours of work placement in an approved facility.

DELIVERY

The training is conducted by a qualified, industry current, trainer and assessor to ensure the learning is relevant and up to date. This training will take place in a classroom environment using face-to-face training methods at one of our study locations. Intakes are scheduled throughout the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification, although applicants will need to undertake an LLN assessment. Students are required to complete a Practical Placement which requires a police check and an NDIS screening.
